

Emmy-Award Winning Filmmaker Ryan Glista has served as the Director and head visionary for this project since its inception. He has been joined by CT-based Choreographer/Dancer/Actor Carolyn Paine since 2022 who serves as the project producer.

Both Glista and Paine share the same overall passion as The Bushnell, constantly striving to develop

new ways to use arts and this technology to not just entertain, but to enrich the community. They recognize the unique power of the arts to strengthen and reenergize Hartford and Glista and Paine specifically wanted to use this platform this season to highlight and celebrate LGBTQ artists.

In early 2023, they combined their talents with Sky Casper Entertainment to present a cunningly clever digital drag show featuring six hilarious local and regional favorite Queens belting showtunes and firing quips (and shoes) back and forth at each other. The timing of the premiere of the digital drag show on the screens in the courtyard outside The Bushnell was also poignant as it happened the same week that drag shows and culture were being silenced in other parts of the country. Paine,

the producer and co-writer of the digital drag show said, "we were so proud to present drag in such a loud, grand public way at The Bushnell."

This summer, following the success of the digital drag show, Glista and Paine next brought a passion project conceived by Glista to life-Stories of Queer Love told through dance. Glista had been wanting to create and film this for the screens since the first season of Local Arts Stage, but it took the additional vision and dance connections of Paine to help make it happen. The concept was to have different choreographers representing diverse styles of dance each tell a story of queer love. The choreographers joining Paine in creating original works were aerialists Stacey Strange and Dani Bobby Lee of New Haven's Air Temple Arts, Garet Wierdsma of Garet & Co (a CT-based contemporary dance company), and LAbased Hip Hop and Latin Choreographer Lyrik Cruz, who is part of the creative team for legend Debbie Allen and has choreographed for TV and film.

Working with the same piece of music edited by Glista, the choreographers rehearsed their dancers individually before coming together to film their stories for the screens and projection-mapped wall at SONO Studios soundstage in Norwalk, CT.

The stories the choreographers chose to tell represent the many facets and journeys of love from tentative exploration, to passionate polyamory, to dynamic and agonizing conflicts. For the choreographers, it was a very personal experience.

Local choreographer Garet Wierdsma said "My identity as a queer person is not something I've explored as an artist yet, so this was nerve-wracking, exciting, and very meaningful. I'm super honored to be a part of this project." Choreographer Lyrik Cruz also felt the weight of getting to put his personal experiences and voice into this work, especially as a gay Puerto Rican. Cruz says "Being able to tell stories from my POV and how it was to hide love from everyone in our neighborhood and our families...finding those moments where you could escape to be partners and boyfriends- that's the story I wanted to tell."

But more than just telling stories of queer love, Cruz acknowledges that all patrons viewing this project on the

screens and the wall will connect deeply with the performances because "At the end of the day, these are not just gay love stories, these are human love stories. Kudos to The Bushnell for doing this."

"Stories of Queer Love" will premiere on the courtyard screens and Grand Foyer projection wall on October 14th as part of the celebration of Theatre Week with a free event at The Bushnell. Visitors at this event will also get to view the Digital Drag Show and all the other digital content from the past few seasons.





Political decisions have been central to the recognition and denial of gay rights. Historical legislation has played a pivotal role, ranging from criminalization to decriminalization, and even to the legalization of same-sex marriage in some regions. The political climate and policy changes continue to affect these rights significantly. In some regions, there has been a rollback in gay rights, while others have celebrated progressive steps. Political advocacy, both supporting and opposing gay rights, has significantly shaped these public policies.

Social media has emerged as a double-edged sword in the struggle for gay rights. LGBTQ+ Timeline

rom ancient civilizations to the present day, the perception and acceptance of homosexuality and gender diversity have witnessed dramatic shifts. Ancient Greece, with its rich tapestry of art and philosophy, celebrated love between men, setting an early benchmark for openness. In his masterpieces, Plato deliberated on the nature of love, not shying away from exploring same-sex attraction. The neighboring Roman Empire, influenced by Greek ideals, initially showcased a level of acceptance for same-sex relationships, provided they fit within the established norms of Roman masculinity and social structure. However, as Christianity's grip strengthened over Rome, a more conservative stance on homosexuality emerged.

Simultaneously, far to the East, Ancient China's literature remained varied. Europe, North America, and parts of hinted at emperors and scholars who, besides their heterosexual commitments driven by the necessity for heirs, found solace in same-sex relationships. India, with its myriad cultures, was no stranger to the acknowledgment of diverse love forms. Its temples, adorned with intricate sculptures, occasionally depicted same-sex unions. The famed "Kamasutra" didn't just focus on heterosexual love but also acknowledged same-sex attraction.

However, as Europe plunged into the Middle Ages, the overarching influence of Christianity brought about a paradigm shift in attitudes towards homosexuality. It was branded as sinful, leading to persecution. The Islamic world, especially during its Golden Age under caliphates like the Abbasids, saw a flourishing of arts that celebrated or at least recognized same-sex love. But with time, stricter interpretations of Islamic teachings veered towards lesser tolerance.

By the time the world entered the 19th century, a fresh challenge arose. Homosexuality was no longer just a moral or religious debate; it became a subject of medical scrutiny. The labeling of same-sex attraction

persisted well into the next century. However, the 20th century's latter half marked a turning point. Post World War II, the Western world witnessed the rise of the gay rights movement, and a tide of change began, culminating in legal and societal recognition for the LGBTQ+ community. Yet, this wave was not uniform. While Europe and parts of the Americas progressed, many regions, influenced by a complex mesh of cultural, religious, and colonial histories, remained resistant.

As the new millennium dawned, the journey of LGBTQ+ rights entered another critical phase. The celebration of same-sex marriage in various countries and the amplification of LGBTQ+ voices on global platforms was heartening. Yet, the tapestry of acceptance

Asia and Latin America showcased an upward trend, but areas like Africa and the Middle East often remained intransigent.

This era also underscored the need to address the unique challenges faced by BIPOC LGBTQ+ individuals. Often grappling with dual prejudices of race and sexual orientation, their struggles highlighted that the path to true equality was multifaceted. Activism and advocacy

Parallelly, transgender rights began to emerge prominently on the global stage. Transgender individuals, historically misunderstood and marginalized, found their voices gaining resonance. However, acceptance was patchy. While advocacy led to significant strides in education, legal rights, and healthcare access, many transgender individuals, especially from BIPOC communities, faced heightened challenges. Interestingly, many Indigenous cultures worldwide had traditionally recognized and honored non-binary and genderdiverse identities. The process of re-embracing these ancient values became an integral part of modern transgender rights discourse.

as a mental disorder began, casting a shadow that Yet, the scars of European colonization remained evident. Many regions, once colonies, still grappled with colonial-era anti-LGBTQ+ laws and sentiments. The journey of acceptance and rights for all, irrespective of their sexual orientation, gender identity, and racial or ethnic backgrounds, continues. While significant strides have been made, the complexities of race, gender, and sexuality persistently challenge the global community. The enduring aspiration is for a world where diversity is not just tolerated but celebrated in all its hues.



rag Queen Story Hour" (DQSH), is a relatively recent movement where drag queens read books to children in libraries, schools, or bookstores. This initiative began in San Francisco in 2015 and quickly spread to other cities around the world. The purpose of DQSH and its significance can be understood from the following perspectives:

Promotion of Literacy: First and foremost, DQSH, like other storytime events, encourages reading and literacy among children. By making reading a fun and interactive experience, it helps cultivate a love for books and stories.

Diversity and Inclusion: DQSH introduces children to individuals who might look or express themselves differently than what they're accustomed to. By interacting with drag queens in a positive and supportive environment, children learn early on about the importance of acceptance, diversity, and being true to oneself.

Breaking Gender Norms: Drag inherently challenges traditional notions of gender and gender expression. Introducing children to drag in a friendly setting can help them understand that gender can be fluid and that there's a broad spectrum of ways to express oneself.

Building Empathy: By hearing stories about characters from various backgrounds and experiences, children can develop empathy and a broader understanding of the world.

Counteracting Bullying: Encouraging acceptance and understanding can also have the positive side effect of reducing bullying. When children are taught to celebrate differences rather than fear or mock them, they are less likely to engage in hurtful behaviors.


Entertainment: Let's not forget the sheer fun and joy of the event! Drag queens are often vibrant, theatrical, and entertaining performers. Children can enjoy the colorful costumes, lively personalities, and spirited storytelling.

Community Building: Such events can also serve as a bridge, fostering positive interactions between diverse groups in the community. It's an opportunity for parents, caregivers, and children to come together in a communal setting, learn from one another, and form connections.

While DQSH has been celebrated by many for these reasons, it's worth noting that it has also faced criticism and backlash in certain circles. Some people believe that drag isn't appropriate for children or have concerns rooted in traditional beliefs about gender. It's essential to approach the topic with an open mind, recognizing the diversity of opinions on the subject, while also understanding the positive intentions and benefits behind the DQSH initiative.
